That was our feeling when we finally made the time to catch the latest exhibition there by artist Catherine Latson on a recent morning.

We <u>first profiled Latson(http://www.wagmag.com/of-a-fashionable-nature/)</u> for a story that ran in our September 2015 issue, focusing on her fashion-themed creations of that time.

We have followed her work since – and didn't want to miss this new show, billed as a look into Latson's "three-dimensional wall sculptures titled the 'Specimen' series, inspired by nature and made from hand-dyed silk embroidery floss, beads and natural findings."

A handful of new works from the intricate and fascinating series are singular in both approach and style, combining Latson's observations of nature with her dedication to craft.

Each one is captivating, offering a study in color, form and more, inviting the viewer to pause and explore.
